Arlington County shares with Washington, DC more than eight miles of shoreline on the Potomac, the Nation's River. Access to the waterfront has long been an issue in Rosslyn, which is separated from the river by the George Washington Parkway. Yet plans for the Georgetown waterfront, the Washington Channel and the Anacostia River could dramatically transform the current shoreline on the DC side of the river.
